

Albert Jackson is forty years old, American and has a truly colourful background. He has worked within corporate advertising (owned his own agency), reprographics, design and art direction at some very high levels, but has also had periods of being that penniless artist living on the breadline, and "no, it is not romantic, it's awful!"

Albert started off in photography; his first camera was a box-brownie, which he won as a prize at a Cub Scout meet. He recalls that he "just went nuts with it" – it was a photographic love affair that has lasted his lifetime.

From photography Albert developed into painting, sculpture and furniture design, "I love functional art" and his steel furniture is at once formidable but strangely practical.

This is the thing with Albert, you cannot box him; he is not just a painter nor sculptor but transcends many levels. He believes "it is important to be on as many creative levels as possible, the more you can learn the more you can absorb and the better you become at improving creativity."

Computers and technology feature heavily in Albert's idea processes, he'll scan in a sketch and then change and view it differently to get "multiple ideas based on an initial one". He comments that "Transitory ideas are wonderful epiphanies but we don't always have time to pursue them." And this way he has everything to refer back to"

One factor that strikes with Albert is his background; there seems to be less, dare I say it, of an 'American' feel to them. Moving to England has prompted Albert to question his American background, "People here (UK) just talk, it's a freer environment and your lives are more fulfilling" – this clearly is an environment that Albert likes to be in. He adds, "By placing yourself in situations and environments that challenge you, you can evolve and grow as a person hence your work changes, evolves and moves forward."
